When in sorrow or grief . . . call Matthew 5:4, John 11:35, John 14:1-3, 1 Thessalonians 4:13-14, Isaiah 51:1-16

When people fail you, call Psalm 27

If you are depressed and feeling down and out . . . call Psalm 27, 42 and 43, Romans 15:13

When you have sinned . . . call Psalm 38:15-22, Psalm 51

When you worry call Matthew 6:19-34

When you are in danger . . . call Psalm 91, 141-144

When God seems far away call Psalm 139, Romans 8:31-39

When your faith needs stirring call Hebrews 11

When you are lonely and fearful call Psalm 23

When you want peace and rest Matthew 11:25-30

When you leave home for labor or travel call Psalm 121

When your prayers grow narrow or selfish call Psalm 67

When the world seems bigger than God, call Psalm 90 (70 & Jeremiah 33:3 ????)

When you want Christian assurance call Romans 8:1-30 (1:1-30?)

When you want courage for a task call Joshua 1

When you think of investments and returns call Mark 10

If your pocketbook is empty call Psalm 37

If you are losing confidence in people call 1 Corinthians 13

If you find the world growing small and yourself great Call Psalm 19

For a guide to rules for Holy living call Colossians 3:1-17

For an understanding of Christianity call 2 Corinthians 5:15-20
